

Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) Guidelines

- MAP tests are given on the computer and are adaptive, where the difficulty of items adjusts with each correct or incorrect response the student provides.
- The Math Goals Survey tests are untimed and ask students to answer about 50 selected response items.
- Third, fourth and fifth grade students take the Math Goals Survey 2-5 test.
- Sixth, seventh and eighth grade students take the Math Goals Survey 6+ test.
- Students are allowed only to use the on-screen calculator when it appears on the screen for particular items.
- Teachers read test directions to students from the provided script.
- Test proctors record scores on a Student Score Log as each student finishes.
- Teachers access on-line reports after testing at <https://reports.nwea.org/login.asp>.
