Welcome:

Introductions by GFPIC members and students. Jessica Sankey, Director in the Department of Teaching and Learning – Wellness, provided a brief overview of the GFPIC purpose and celebrations.

DECA Student Presentation – Student Stores & Coffee Sales:

Purpose of Presentation: Students proposed to implement high quality coffee through the Sehome student shop.

- Students shared facts from schools in the area currently selling coffee, surveyed students and teachers at Sehome High School regarding whether they would drink the coffee and discussed cost estimates for projected profits.
- Students shared where the coffee would be located, training involved, price of coffee and cost estimates for equipment and materials to sell coffee.
- Students shared some of the benefits of selling coffee at the school site including; size of coffee would be predetermined, and limitations would be put on the amount of sugar added to coffee, students working in the store would be receiving onsite training, onsite coffee availability would help keep students on campus and any profits that may accrue could go back into the schools.

Review Updated Guidance for Fundraisers:

- Committee member asked about the process for approval of such requests from students or parents to fundraise. Currently there no policies or procedures in place for fundraising.
- Committee members agreed the positives of the implementation of the request by students to present to the committee it opened dialog between student and the district, keeps students on campus, and real-life learning in the store setting with trying new ideas to serve their peers.
- Jessica shared creating a pros and cons list and a process to continue to build a relationship with students and schools.
- Committee members looked over the draft form of the Fundraising Guidelines and shared feedback on further changes that may help the form be more concise.
