



**Minutes Meeting #9
Parkview Elementary School
Ed Spec/Design Advisory Committee
Monday, March 25, 2019**

Mylo Allen, Parkview Elementary principal, thanked the committee for meeting on a shorter notice, stating it was nice to continue the momentum from conversations from the March 6, 2019 meeting prior to spring break.

The minutes were reviewed and approved as amended.

Mylo stated the intent for today's meeting was to review the site and floor plan in terms of consensus. He reviewed the group's Design Goals from the [Parkview Education Specification](#).

- Is this a neighborhood school?
- Did we provide a quality teaching and learning environment?
- Have we provided spaces in the building that support collaboration and community?
- Are we meeting the needs of the whole child – playground, coming off the bus, etc.
- Is the school expressing the central qualities of warmth and welcome stability and the importance of the school's place in the community as a neighbor?

As the committee reviewed the site and floor plans, Mylo asked them to consider if the plans meet the criteria of what the group described at the beginning of this project.

Terry Brown, Zervas Group architect, shared revised drawings. From productive committee feedback received at the last meeting, the architects took those suggestions and incorporated them into the plan.

As presented on the site plan, the building was rotated slightly to parallel the parent drop off/pick up curve. This opens some outside space to the north and surrounding covered play area.

The committee thanked Zervas architects for listening and implementing their suggestions. Having a site that is restricted in size and layout helped to create a more unique design that feels connected to the property.

Mylo then took a vote from the group, asking if the plans embody all the goals we identified as a team. The committee unanimously supported both site and floor plans.

Mylo shared his excitement about having a design we are ready to share with community and Parkview staff, and he thanked everyone for their time and energy with this process.

A community meeting will be scheduled in April or May that will include an introduction, project overview, and sharing a site and floor plan. Ron Cowan, Executive Director of Capital Projects and

School Facilities encouraged everyone to be in attendance. The group will have a brief meeting following the community meeting to confirm the committee's decision to make a formal recommendation to Dr. Baker or to make adjustments based on community feedback.

At the conclusion, Terry introduced Matt Reeves from Zervas who will be working with Terry on the project. Terry then thanked the committee for their input and efforts, adding this has been an informed group and the plans show that energy.
