



Minutes Meeting #2
Squalicum High School
Turf Fields Phase 2 Planning Committee
Monday, April 15, 2019

Ron Cowan, Executive Director of Capital Projects and School Facilities, welcomed committee members.

Minutes from the April 8, 2019 meeting were reviewed and unanimously approved.

Ron asked the group if they had questions from last week's meeting. Questions and responses included:

- Will there be power at the softball field?
 - Yes, there will be power at the softball dugout, home plate and the storage building.
- Can we build an additional staircase from the upper parking lot to the football field/track so students move to the field more quickly for fire drills and staging?
 - No new staircase will be built. There will be multiple turf fields, so fire drills and staging can be modified to have some students use the new fields and some students continue to use the football field/track area.
- Will there be funds available for signage?
 - Yes.
- Will the school have full access to the football field/track during construction?
 - Yes.
- Will students be able to continue using the gate on Magrath to get into the school site?
 - Yes. Except for limited timeframes during construction, the access from Magrath will be available for use.
- Is it possible to add ball netting on the west side of the existing football field?
 - Yes. Alternate bid pricing will be requested for a 15' high net.
- Can the softball field storage building be moved to the home dugout side?
 - Yes, if the topography allows.

Jeff Burke with Premier Fields shared possible turf colors and markings for the new fields. The committee recommended the following:

- New Soccer/Multi-Purpose field:
 - Solid green turf
 - Turf markings for boys and girls lacrosse; gray and black to be consistent with markings on the existing turf field
 - Soccer markings in yellow
 - Storm logo in the center
- Baseball and Softball:
 - Two tone green turf at 5-yard intervals
 - Brown infield, warning track and in batting cages

Since some varsity contests will be played on the new fields, flag poles will be needed. Jeff will work with Patrick Brown, Activities/Athletic Coordinator on flag pole locations. An initial idea is that football and baseball can share a pole as can softball and soccer.

Ron asked the committee if anyone had additional questions or concerns with the proposed field and support facilities (storage, restrooms, etc.) plans. Hearing none, he queried the committee for an indicator of consensus on the plans by indicating 'thumbs up', 'thumbs sideways' or 'thumbs down.' The committee expressed unanimous consensus with all members giving the 'thumbs up' sign.

Ron indicated that the next step is to host a neighborhood/community project Open House to provide information about the project and receive input on the proposed plans.

Following that meeting, the committee will decide whether to amend the proposed plans or send the plans to Dr. Baker as their recommendation to move forward.

The meeting adjourned at 4:45 p.m.
