

Letter to Students and Families – Bellingham Public Schools TSE Driver Training

Bellingham Public School TSE - Driver Training, our commitment to your health and safety is our number one priority.

With the recent rise in concern for the 2019-nCoV infection (Coronavirus), we want to assure you that Bellingham Public School TSE - Driver Training is taking all necessary precautions.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the best way to prevent infection is to avoid being exposed to the virus. However, the CDC also lists the following actions to help prevent the spread of respiratory viruses:

- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after going to the bathroom; before eating; and after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing.
- If soap and water are not readily available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol. Always wash hands with soap and water if hands are visibly dirty.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Stay home when you are sick.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces using a regular household cleaning spray or wipe.

Bellingham Public School TSE - Driver Training staff have always practiced the above precautionary actions and will continue to do so in accordance with the CDC.
